Are you prepared to have the conversation about meningitis and the vaccines that are available to help prevent meningitis, especially in the at risk 16-23 age group? If not, have the conversation with your patient and their parent or guardian. Having two types of the meningitis vaccine can make a difference – and could quite likely save the life of your patient.

NEW RELEASE: NH Pediatric Mental Health Care Report

The NH Pediatric Improvement Partnership (NHPIP) has released a <u>summary report</u> of findings from an analysis of pediatric mental health care claims data for 2019. Entitled the "New Hampshire Children and Teens Experiencing Mental Health Disorders: An Analysis of 2019 Healthcare Claims Data", this <u>report</u> reviews for the 0-18 population in NH:

- The burden of pediatric mental health conditions
- Mental health conditions and comorbidities with other mental health conditions, and
- Mental health medical and pharmaceutical service utilization

2019 Claims data for both Medicaid and commercially insured child and teens are analyzed.

This <u>**report**</u> was financially supported by the NH Mental Health Care Access in Pediatrics (MCAP) program, a HRSA-funded grant to NH Department of Health and Human Services with partnership from the UNH Institute for Health Policy and Practice (IHPP) and the NHPIP. NH PIP is a collaborative between the Children's Hospital at Dartmouth and the UNH IHPP.
